Again, this is beginning to express our pain and hurt from years of subjection to control by others without due respect and regard for one's true personality.

Adolescent's Community Safe House – transitioning from oppressive parents to freedom

Being able to leave home and be one's true self takes time – consider two years of focused discovery and self-expression while learning how to integrate into a community.

Pascas Craft Creations – escaping from substance abuse

We do everything possible to suppress the pain of our childhood suppression. Not only do we have to heal ourselves of our addictions but ALSO heal ourselves of our childhood suppression, both through Feeling Healing.

These four pathways are delivered through on location residency and professional support.

Chaldi College – education from pre-school through to seniors

Feeling Healing and Living Feelings First is introduced to all avenues of living to everyone who are open to consider the potential that it opens for each of us.

The residential configuration may commence with these ratios, however, adjust with need.

Further, the numbers participating in each of the four core programs may widely vary from the above without administrative difficulty due to compatible and over lapping agendas.

PASCAS FAMILY SHELTERS

Provision of Family Shelter accommodation is to be considered in modules of 10 and then of larger modules of 100. This is to bring about practical support arrangements. Support counsellors are more appropriately engaged in supporting ten women or six mothers with ten children.

When providing educating and training facilities, then the diversity of requirements tend to generate practical utilisation when supporting 100 accommodation units. Such accommodation units maybe 1, 2, 3 or more beds. Consider a configuration of 30 x 1 bedrooms, 30 x 2 bedrooms, 30 x 3 bedrooms and then 10 units with 4 or even more bedrooms. Essentially the population per unit is not to exceed six persons all being of the one family.

Consider a budget of AU\$50 million for 100 units with facilities being AU\$500,000 per unit.

Gold Coast City Council population is about 650,000 as of June 2021. Presently, a cluster of 100 units having a combination of 1 bedroom, 2 bedroom, 3 bedroom and larger options (housing for 300) is a priority on the Gold Coast in at least two locations. This emergency shortage relief. Brisbane City population is about 2,650,000. Priority is for six or more locations to be provided with 100 units each. Queensland overall population is more than 5,500,000. Fourteen locations need to established, each with 100 units.

A base need is one such complex for every 330,000 population, thus seventeen Shelter Housing projections would commence to mitigate the pressing need for emergency shelter for domestic violence and homelessness throughout Queensland.

Australia's population is approaching 26 million, that suggests 78 facilities (7,800 units) throughout Australia is now required and then a shortfall will still need addressing. At an average of 3 persons per unit, that equates to provision for 23,400 persons and the known shortfall is being estimated at 520,000. This agenda addresses only 5%.

Budget AU\$500,000 per unit, a 100 unit complex budget may be AU\$50,000,000. 78 facilities would amount to AU\$3.12 billion and then add community Pascas Cafes as well as medium and smaller shelters for regional communities; then a budget of AU\$5 billion is to provide for establishment and ongoing operating costs until the facilities become financially self funding. The focus of this endeavour is to primarily address the shortfall in housing availability for domestic violence victims and non-residents.

PASCAS FOOD BASKET

One in five Australians experience food insecurity each year. Food that is rejected for various reasons by commercial outlets can be collected and made available through numerous charities via a central collection warehouse and redistribution centre. Food Bank is well known for its achievements. Pascas Food Basket

is now to be established on the Gold Coast / Tweed area to service those in need of food in amongst the population of 630,000 people.

PASCAS is a GLOBAL OPERATION:

INDIA – Through the endeavours of the Archbishop of the Church of India, Sri Lanka, Burma and Pakistan, the schools and associated assets that have been purloined by wayward clergy are being returned to their appropriate purposes through the high courts of India. Pascas is to support this endeavour.

St Mary's School Lucknow – due to Covid-19, the 1,000 student campus has reduced to 200 attendees with the balance home schooling. This has decimated resources and highlighted the need for a very significant number of computers and associated assistance throughout the school and for students in their homes. Pascas is to support this endeavour.

Lucknow School in the Muslim district – A proposed school is to be built for 3,000 girls and 3,000 boys on a 10 hectare site, two campuses on the same site. Without such a configuration, the girls would not have school facilities. Pascas is to support this endeavour.

Pascas Sanctuary Village – this is a project in Uttar Pradesh through the Archbishop's administration.

Pascas Clinics and Hospital – these are also under the administration of the Archbishop or as appropriate.

PAPUA NEW GUINEA – A major agenda for universal education throughout Papua New Guinea is to be evolved through professional educators from within PNG. Pascas supports this endeavour.

VANUATU and SOLOMON ISLANDS – South Pacific Business Development is to be supported in their delivery of micro-finance loans to women. This will extend throughout the Pacific Island Nations including Papua New Guinea.

There is a great deal coming together for Australia and the rest of the world that Pascas is drawing to its attention and, no doubt, the list will blossom from here.

Now is the time for Pascas to begin in earnest its long term agenda.

Chairman's Review

Pascas Foundation (Aust) Limited was incorporated as a not-for-profit organisation on 16 September 2008. We are now fourteen years young. AU\$1,770,796 has been provided for activities supported by Pascas in these past fourteen years of which a further AU\$210,000 was provided during this current financial year ending 30 June 2022.

Last year, we outlined the major aspects of what will unfold as a Pascas world headquarters. We referred to it as PASCAS – Pimpama Village.

PASCAS – Paradise Village is an adjunct for the world headquarters. Paradise Village is to be a residential arrangement for those who intend to focus and live feelings orientated.

In recent months, we have explored and structured agendas for several nations. This is devastating in how raw and difficult are the circumstances prevailing within nations that are clearly unique to themselves. When we ask the people of each of these nations what they perceive as needed, they cannot identify their needs. It is as though they cannot see the forest because of the trees. They live within the turnoil and crisis and yet accept it all as being normal - and it is to them.

Their education system needs to be doubled in size and then doubled again – as also their health services.

All facets of communication throughout PNG are problematic. Though an island nation with most living on the mainland, the road system is not complete with many regions only accessible by canoe or on foot. There are many tribal groupings and hundreds of languages. Electric power is limited and often in short supply. Thus, we have an ethos of living in survival mode and, corruption thrives.

The national psychic barrier of tribal traditions and suspicions is evident in many unique ways within every province throughout PNG. These barriers need to be addressed – this will take time.

Worldwide, missionaries lifted the people but then development stagnated, their contribution for those they assisted is reflected in MoC of around only 220. Australia calibrates overall at 410. Australia is not a benchmark for the world, however, it is a reference point. Australia has a great deal of issues that it is also to resolve, like every other nation on Earth.

Open and universally free education is to be provided throughout PNG. This is to be free of any direct religion institutional involvement, free from governmental restraints, with the focus being upon the needs of the people for them to evolve and prosper.

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Solomon Islands' median age is 22.5 years and the overall Map of Consciousness is 220.

Again, the workforce is a small percentage with children dominating the population.

The Solomon Islands consist of six major and approximately 900 smaller volcanic islands, coral atolls and reefs, more than 300 of them are inhabited. Thus, boating is the major transportation and this is costly and random in availability. Commercialisation of cottage / village industries has been fragmented and limited.

Traditions and customs reflect psychic barriers that are unique to the nation of the Solomon Islands.

Education services needs to be doubled and through a comprehensive education network embracing the needs of children as well as adults, then the shortages in all professions, particularly health, can start to be addressed.

Ukraine's median age is 41.2 years and the overall Map of Consciousness is 330.

Over 2,000 schools, 500 cultural sites destroyed in Ukraine – Ukraine Defense Ministry (5 August 2022). According to Ukraine's health ministry, **746 medical facilities have been damaged** by Russian attacks since 24 February 2022 — an additional **123 facilities have been completely destroyed** (28 July 2022).

The insane bear is still in town and the mayhem now appears to be a war of attrition with no ending until both sides are exhausted. The damage to both Russia and Ukraine will be enduring.

The high median age of Ukraine is why you see so many soldiers with white beards!

70,000 children were in orphanages before the commencement of the war. Their needs are a priority to be addressed. The existing budget provided per child per day for food is US\$1.53, for medical per month is US\$0.61, and for clothing, etc., is US\$0 per quarter. This is to be supplemented with US\$10 per day for food, US\$285 per month for medical support, and US\$250 for clothing, etc. There is a great deal needed to repair buildings and to address heating issues.

Until the conflict abates, this is a holding situation. The inherent issues throughout Ukraine are now escalating as the destruction unfolds.

Angola's median age is 16.7 years and the overall Map of Consciousness is 80.

The **Angolan War of Independence** (1961–1974) was followed by the **Angolan Civil War** beginning in 1975 and continuing, with interludes, until 2002. More than forty years of internal conflict has left the population of Angola with a legacy that requires lifting the people out of conditions that prevailed 600 years before the time of Christ of the 1^{st} century – at that time the world consciousness was 80!

Family planning to be a focus for the medical centres. Hospitals equipped with diagnostic services and operating facilities comparable to institutions worldwide.

Required for the nation:

Hydro-electric power on a scale that not only is reliable but services all people and industries throughout the nation. Then go on and expand the hydro-electric production to export electricity to nations throughout out Africa as far north as the equator. This is to be a national revenue stream for Angola and its people. Presently, **less than 20% of potential hydro power is developed or being developed**.



School enrolment, secondary, female (% gross) in India was reported at **75.28** % in 2020, according to the World Bank collection of development indicators, compiled from officially recognised sources. More than 50% of girls fail to enrol in school; those that do are likely to drop out by the age of 12. 50% of Indian children aged 6-18 do not go to school. 17 million children in India work as per official estimates.

The caste system, dating back to 1200 BCE, or much further, is a form of discrimination that had been officially outlawed in 1955; however, its influence thrives in India's modern-day education system. On the top of the system is a group called the Brahmins, and at the very bottom are Dalits ("untouchables"). This method has kept many Dalit girls secluded from promising scholastic endeavours. These children are often from their peers segregated during lunchtime and ridiculed by them in class. This rhetoric causes 51% of Dalit children to drop out of elementary school. Another law passed in 1989 was supposed to protect the Dalit caste, but it is not being sufficiently enforced. More than 30% of India's population embrace the caste system.



The survey finds that three-in-ten Indians (30%) identify themselves as members of General Category castes.

The caste system of India is a demonstration of Childhood Suppression on a grand scale firmly entrenched into the dogmas of national religions. This is institutionalised Childhood Suppression through major religions. Its anchor is in the false belief of reincarnation which never happens, cannot happen, is a most unloving belief and a gross error of teachings.

The suppression of women throughout India is readily recognised in population statistics. There is an imbalance with maybe 60 million girls missing due to infanticide.

The Caste System is truly a national psychic barrier that needs to be confronted and addressed. Education is the paramount pathway in addressing all the major issues throughout India's societies.

Summary:

The nations that we have completed a review of and the nations we are to work with are all unique in their dispositions and conditions. We are observing a great diversity of current situations and also uniqueness in the style of psychic barriers applicable to each nation, all of which will require long term attention to enable the population and subsequently the nation to put aside and evolve beyond these limitations.

The pathway forward for each nation is oddly the same! Clearly, education is to become a profession, rather than a trade. Medicine has recognised more than 10,000 'diseases' and only 'cures' for 500. In fact, Childhood Suppression, commencing at conception and concluding around the age of 6 years, is the underlying cause of all discomfort, pain, illness, disease, childbirth deformities and disease in the child prior and post birth.

While we live mind centric, we are entombing our personality and potential in a steel wrecking ball with no way to evolve beyond 499 on Dr David R Hawkins' Map of Consciousness. This is why we have such an incredible array of insanity being displayed and demonstrated worldwide.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

THE PRODUCT:

Angola's population is significant (approximately 35,100,000) with 23.5 million people living in urban (67%) regions of Angola as of 2021, while the rural (33%) population exceeded 11.5 million. Angola has 1 city (Luanda) with more than a million people, 6 cities with between 100,000 and 1 million people, and 23 cities with between 10,000 and 100,000 people.

The product is the consequence of need. The population of Angola calibrates around 80 on Dr David R Hawkins' Map of Consciousness (MoC) scale which is based on the common log of 10. The world population overall is 220 and Australia is 410 MoC.

The **Angolan War of Independence** (1961–1974), began as an uprising against forced cultivation of cotton, and it became a multi-faction struggle for the control of Portugal's overseas province of Angola among three nationalist movements and a separatist movement. It was a guerrilla war in which the Portuguese army and security forces waged a counter-insurgency campaign against armed groups mostly dispersed across sparsely populated areas of the vast Angolan countryside. Many atrocities were committed by all forces involved in the conflict. In the end, the Portuguese achieved overall military victory.

In Angola, after the Portuguese withdrew, an armed conflict broke out among the nationalist movements. This war formally came to an end in January 1975. Informally, this civil war resumed by May 1975, including street fighting in Luanda and the surrounding countryside.

The Angolan Civil War was a civil war in Angola, beginning in 1975 and continuing, with interludes, until 2002. The war immediately began after Angola became independent from Portugal in November 1975. The war was a power struggle between two former anti-colonial guerrilla movements, the communist People's Movement for the Liberation of Angola (MPLA) and the turned anti-communist National Union for the Total Independence of Angola (UNITA). The war was used as a surrogate battleground for the Cold War by rival states such as the Soviet Union, Cuba, South Africa, and the United States. (Forty years of national conflict!)

José Eduardo dos Santos was the president of Angola from 1979 to 2017. As president, dos Santos was also the commander-in-chief of the Angolan Armed Forces (FAA) and president of the People's Movement for the Liberation of Angola (MPLA), the party that has ruled Angola since it won independence in 1975. He was the second-longest-serving president in Africa.

João Manuel Gonçalves Lourenço, is an Angolan politician who has served as the president of Angola since 26 September 2017. Previously, he was Minister of Defence from 2014 to 2017. In September 2018, he became the Chairman of the People's Movement for the Liberation of Angola (MPLA), the ruling party.





English is generally the dominant language but only 15% speak it!

The cultural traits of each of the European colonisers were injected into the fabric of the islands they colonised; thus, the languages, religions, and economic activities of the colonised islands reflected those of the European colonisers rather than those of the native people who had inhabited the islands originally. THE PRODUCT:

Approximately 1.6 million Colombians who, during the pandemic, were knocked out of the middle class and back into poverty.

The unequal distribution of the country's wealth and welfare resources affects Colombian people and is a cause of poverty. The country's income concentration is very high compared to the international averages. The per capita income of the richest ten percent is 46 times greater than those of the poorest ten percent.

Colombia poverty rate for 2020 was **38.30%**, an **8.9% increase** from 2019. Poverty headcount ratio at US\$5.50 a day is the percentage of the population living on less than US\$5.50 a day at 2011 international prices.

The economy saw a recovery in 2021, and the national poverty rate dropped to 39.3%. The decline was led by urban areas, with poverty increasing in rural areas (from 42.9% in 2020 to 44.6% in 2021).

The education system is reporting classrooms across the nation with 40 or more students. Class size is **40 to 50 students**. Unlike students in most countries, Colombian students cannot choose their courses. The school day is 7 to 8 hours. Teachers are generally inadequately trained and supported. Consequently, higher education is not being provided with capable students coming through from high school, this is reflected in the quality of students graduating into all fields of industry and commerce.

Then you have the inadequacies throughout all industries not being able to obtain the capable staff required to grow commence and mitigate the requirements in all areas of commerce and deliver the solutions needed by every sector of Colombian society.

The evolutionary growth of the people of Colombia is hampered by an administration without perception and intuitive initiative. The people of Colombia are very tolerant. The figures on sexual violence were also very high, 15% of girls and 7% of boys reported being a victim of sexual violence, with 72% of sexual abuse incidents happening at home. An alarming figure in the report, that reveals the severity of these statistics, is that every 20 minutes a child in Colombia suffers sexual abuse.

SPAIN colonised the COLOMBIA and sold PANAMA to the United States America

Colombia was 'discovered' by Spain in 1400. It was not until **1525**, however, that the Spanish began a process of colonization of Colombia, leading to it becoming an integrated colony of the Spanish empire.

The **separation of Panama from Colombia** was formalised on 3 November 1903, with the establishment of the Republic of Panama. When the United States sought to take over the canal project, the

government of Colombia proved difficult to work with, and with the cooperation of French financier Philippe-Jean Bunau-Varilla, Panama simultaneously declared independence from Colombia and negotiated a treaty granting the U.S. the right to construct the Panama Canal. In exchange, Panama received US\$10 million and an annuity of US\$250,000 beginning nine years later.

The Treaty of Paris ending the Spanish-American War was signed on December 10, 1898. In it, Spain renounced all claim to **Cuba**, ceded **Guam and Puerto Rico** to the United States and transferred sovereignty over the **Philippines** to the United States for US\$20 million.

STREET KIDS

Almost a quarter of Colombia's 12 million children between the ages of 5 and 17 do not attend school due to poverty, displacement and violence. A Universidad Externado de Colombia study from 2007 said 35.4% of all children in Colombia did not live with their parents. It is estimated that about 60,000 children live on Colombia's streets – 37% of them in Bogota.

EDUCATION

Tertiary education has been expanding in the last decades, and, in 2020, 25-34 year-old women were more likely than men to achieve tertiary education in all OECD countries. In Colombia, 34% of 25-34 year-old women had a tertiary qualification in 2020 compared to 26% of their male peers, while on average across OECD countries the shares were 52% among young women and 39% among young men.

Across most OECD countries, socio-economic status influences learning outcomes more than gender and immigrant status. In Colombia, the proportion of children from the bottom quartile of the PISA index of economic, social and cultural status (ESCS) achieving at least PISA level 2 in reading in 2018 was 56% lower than that of children from the top ESCS quartile, a larger share than the OECD average of 29%.

Annual expenditure per student on educational institutions provides an indication of the investment countries make on each student. After accounting for public-to-private transfers, public expenditure on primary to tertiary educational institutions per full-time student in Colombia was USD 2,425 in 2018 (in equivalent USD converted using PPPs for GDP) compared to USD 10,000 on average across OECD countries.

Open and free education from primary schooling, through high schooling, technical and further education (colleges) and then university can be the only driver of any society's progress and development – particularly for the Colombians. Between 1990 and 2010, access to *improved sanitation increased from 67% to 82*%, but access to improved water sources increased only slightly from 89% to 94%.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

THE PRODUCT:

India, officially the **Republic of India** (Hindi: *Bhārat Gaṇarājya*), is a country in South Asia. It is the seventh-largest country by area, the second-most populous country, and the most populous democracy in the world. India is bounded by the Indian Ocean on the south, the Arabian Sea on the southwest, and the Bay of Bengal on the southeast, it shares land borders with Pakistan to the west; China, Nepal, and Bhutan to the north; and Bangladesh and Myanmar to the east. It is in the vicinity of Sri Lanka and the Maldives; its Andaman and Nicobar Islands share a maritime border with Thailand, Myanmar and Indonesia.

India's population is significant (approximately 1,406,000,000) with 504 million (35.9%) people living in urban regions of India as of 2022, while the rural population exceeded 902 million (64.1%). The 3 UAs (urbanised areas) with populations of 10 million and above are known as Mega Cities. The census defines the three as **Greater Mumbai UA (18.4 million)**, **Delhi UA (16.3 million) and Kolkata UA (14.1 million)**.

The people of India are a very complex mix of incomprehensible backgrounds and possibilities.

Indigenous population are the most marginalised and vulnerable communities in India which constitutes 8.6% of India's total population, four times higher than the total population of Australia. The state of Jharkhand (north easterly state – land of the forest) accounts for 27.7% of the total indigenous population of India.

According to Census-2011, the number of scheduled tribe members in India is 104,281,034. It is 8.6% of the total population of India. A total of 93,819,162 people belonging to scheduled tribes reside in rural areas whereas 10,461,872 people in urban areas. The scheduled tribes are 11.3% of the total population of rural areas and 2.8% of urban areas. There are more than 705 ethnic groups scheduled as **tribes in India**. So how many Indian languages are there? While India has 22 separate official languages, it is home to a total of **121 languages and 270 mother tongues**. It's also home to the world's oldest language, **Hindi**. **India is** a union of 28 states and 8 union territories.

Though religious groups grew at uneven rates between 1951 and 2011, every major religion in India saw its numbers rise. For example, Hindus increased from 304 million (30.4 crore) to 966 million (96.6 crore), Muslims grew from 35 million (3.5 crore) to 172 million (17.2 crore), and the number of Indians who say they are Christian rose from 8 million (0.8 crore) to 28 million (2.8 crore).

And wealth inequality is more pronounced. The poorest half of the Indian population possesses just 5.9% of the country's total wealth, whereas the richest 10% controls 64.7%.

The top 10% and top 1% in India hold 57% and 22% of the total national income respectively while the bottom 50% share has gone down to 13%. The average national income of the Indian adult population is Rs 204,200 (rupees) (US\$2,552). Here, the bottom 50% of earns Rs 53,610 (US\$670) while the top 10% earns Rs 1,166,520 (US\$14,581), over 20 times more.



Homeless girls are especially at risk of trauma and sexual exploitation, potentially leading to pregnancies producing new generations of street people. EDUCATION

Education, nationally, the average class size in primary schools was approximately twenty-seven, while upper-level classes included between thirty and forty students. Indonesians are required to attend 12 years of school. Students must go to school five days a week from 07:30 a.m. until 15.30 p.m. Students can

choose between state-run, non-sectarian public schools supervised by the Ministry of National Education (Kemdiknas) or private or semi-private religious (usually Islamic) schools supervised and financed by the Ministry of Religious Affairs. Students can choose to participate in extracurricular activities provided by the school such as sports, arts, or religious studies.

In Indonesia, 19% of 25-34 year-olds had a tertiary qualification in 2021 compared to 47% on average across OECD countries.

Indonesia's biggest challenge regarding education is no longer improving access but improving quality. The Indonesian Government hopes to develop a 'world-class' education system by 2025. However, numerous assessments of the country's education performance suggest that it has a long way to go before it will achieve that goal. 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





EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

THE PRODUCT:

Sri Lanka's crisis is not just about the economy, but a long history of discrimination against minority groups. Sri Lanka is in the grip of an economic, political and humanitarian crisis. Politicians like Wickremesinghe and Rajapaksa have been put in positions of political power by the majority Sinhalese people due to their Sinhalese Buddhist nationalist ideology, which has resulted in a long history of discrimination and rioting against minorities on the island. 

THE PRODUCT:

The longer the war continues, **the medium to longer-term needs that conflict-affected people, internally displaced peoples, and returnees will face to rebuild their lives** will similarly rise and require sustained support from the humanitarian and broader international community.

The UN's International Organisation for Migration (IOM) said in May that <u>more than seven million people</u> <u>remain internally displaced</u>:

- 27% of refugees were from the Kharkiv region
- 16% from Kyiv
- 16% from the Donetsk region in eastern Ukraine
- 24% indicated their homes had been damaged or attacked in the war.

The International Organisation for Migration (IOM) estimates that more than half of the people who are internally displaced are women. Many are particularly vulnerable because they are pregnant or have small children, have a disability or are a victim of violence.












Median Wealth per Adult






Map of global human genetic diversity




A map of countries with universal healthcare.

Red means no universal or free healthcare.










Food Security Index World Map




Domestic consumer food price inflation around the world, January 2022 (year-on-year change in food consumer price index, %)










Figure 3. Headcount Ratios for Global MPI, Severe Poverty and \$1.90/day







Median Income by Country 2022













PISA 2018 Worldwide Ranking - average score of mathematics, science and reading - click to enlarge







The Most Loving Countries in the World

Ahh, love — is there any greater feeling? Whether felt for family, friends, partners or pets, it's an emotion that most people have experienced, no matter where they live in the world. But if online displays of affection are anything to go by, are some countries more loving than others?

To find out, we searched for tweets posted in 96 countries containing variations of the phrase "love you" and calculated the proportion of lovey-dovey tweets per 100k local tweets overall. Our data reveals that Guatemala is the most loving country of all, with 2,217 loving tweets per 100k.





There are 193 independent countries recognised by the United Nations, as well as two observer states (Palestine and Vatican City). When other nations and territories are included, there are 330 individual entities in the world.

For example, while the UN recognises the United Kingdom as one country, its individual nations of England, Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland appear on the list of 330 nations but not the United Kingdom. While the British Virgin Islands, or Bermuda, or Moldova's Transnistria, or Australia's Lord Howe Island, or so many others are hardly independent countries, they are sufficiently separate from their country of rule to count as one of the 330 nations.

Further, larger nations may break up in numerous smaller nations thus further increasing the number of independent nations. Conversely, boundaries may come down.
