Soup Kitchen

Every Saturday afternoon we cook a meal for the children in the resettlement camp. Our objective is to assist orphans and vulnerables.



Heartfelt greetings to you and welcome in our sanctuary.

This following excerpt of our constitution is provided herewith, to share with you more about our vision and how we wish to make a difference, not only in the lives of children, but also whole communities and empowering communities in providing care for their loved ones and young ones.

Our Organisation's vision is a self- empowered community taking care of their vulnerable, neglected, abused or orphaned children, honouring their basic human rights, safety and protection, healing and love, and provision in basic needs.

Our Organisation has the following major aims and objectives:

• To provide a safe environment for orphans and other vulnerable children by managing and maintaining a Residential Child Care Facility, after consultation, approval and registration by Ministry of gender Equality and Child Welfare.

• To protect and promote the rights of orphans and other vulnerable children through advocacy, raising awareness, and information dissemination within the community.

• To empower orphans and vulnerable children by involving them in educational programs eg afternoon study groups, computer literacy classes, walks in the veld with elders teaching traditional herbs and plants etc. thereby contributing towards their education for school and for life.

• To contribute to a better living standard of OVC's in the community by providing in their basic needs.

• To contribute to poverty alleviation by developing and running income –generating projects and job creation.

• To solicit funds national and internationally for the successful functioning of the organization.

The functions of our organisation in the affected community, are:

• To be engaged in rural communities, especially for the Hu-Huasi (San Buschman) indigenous population,

• to provide a safe and welcoming environment for orphaned, vulnerable and neglected children due to HIV/Aids , illnesses, poverty, or other socio-economic circumstances;

• to create a safe environment for children who have been deprived of their basic human rights by building a Residential Child Care Facility (children's home and home of safety),

• to be engaged in facilitating re-integration of a child into family structure and its primary community;

• to provide a place of safety, proper medical assessments and care, having access to Schooling and Education,

• to have access to a balanced daily diet through produce from sustainable gardens,

• to assist in the upliftment of schooling of orphans and vulnerable children by involving them in educational programs, e.g. afternoon study groups, computer literacy classes, walks in the veld with elders teaching traditional herbs and plants etc., thereby contributing towards their education for school and for life.

• to improve the living standard of poor and vulnerable children in our care (in the children's home and home of safety) and in the community by providing for their basic needs, such as food, clothing, hostel- and school fees through donations or other means of support.

• Our presence in the community will indirectly contribute to poverty alleviation by generating jobs by engaging members of community, e.g. Making bricks for the buildings, by employing members of community as house mothers and caregivers, by training and employing members to work in office of organisation, in the kitchen, in the gardens.

The Area of operation of our Organisation

Our organisation will operate in the Omaheke Region of Namibia and will lobby for funds nationally and internationally.



The Children's Sanctuary Namibia

Only recently, in February 2013, did we become established as an organization. Long before that, since May 2012, Theresa Matengu, my beloved sister in this work of Love, had been feeding about 30 children out of her kitchen every Saturday. When I knocked on her door in December 2012, it was a moment of soul recognition; we both knew it was God who brought us together to do His work.

Shortly thereafter, dear friends in Canada, Australia, USA and other places began to generously support us by sending the money we desperately needed to expand our feeding program.



In January 2013, we moved our soup kitchen into the Community Centre in Drimiopsis to serve more children, mainly orphans and the most vulnerable. There, we have a little office to store our food and utensils.

The cooking is done over an open fire; buckets of water have to be carried in. Our volunteers, 15 women and 3 men, are very dedicated and no task is too big.



The initial group of 80 children now averages 220 children every Saturday. We budget \$35 US to \$40 US for each feed. We hope to be able to offer the meal twice weekly in the coming months and gradually increase to daily meals.

Children's Sanctuary Namibia (CSN) has a parcel in the community garden in which we planted seeds. Our 3 men are very active caring for the garden and tending our vegetables.





At the moment we are waiting for the paperwork to be processed by the Ministry of Lands and Resettlement that will make CSN legal owners of the piece of land allocated. At the same time the registration process for qualification as a welfare organization is underway. The social workers in Gobabis are informed and we are working closely together to get the most benefit for our children.

The next step is to raise funds for an orphanage. Initially we will start with one structure including kitchen, office and room to accommodate the first 5 children and a housemother. As we establish 4 more family homes over the next 5 years, the initial building will become the administration building and provide accommodation for volunteers (from overseas).

Our sincere gratitude to all the loving people who make this all possible. **You** make it all possible. May God bless you! We express our heartfelt appreciation and gratitude for the generosity you show by supporting us. We sincerely hope to welcome you into our homes sometime in the future. Drimiopsis (Gobabis) Namibia PO Box 660, Gobabis Namibia

Drimiopsis is about 45 kilometres north of Gobabis in the Omaheke province of Namibia.

Helge has lived on a farming property outside of Drimiopsis and is also a qualified pharmacist having lived and worked that profession in Washington State of the United States.

The Children's Sanctuary Namibia is currently feeding daily 300 orphaned and abandoned Bushmen children in Drimiopsis. This is only one of nineteen resettlement camps in the Kalahari regions of Namibia.

In addition to feeding these children daily, their housing is yet to be built, as well as a school and other supporting facilities. The children do not have a school, let alone any school books, paper or writing utensils. Health facilities and support is nominal.

English is spoken in the area and your local English based school material will greatly assist.

The development for the children is to ultimately enable them to gain meaningful paid employment.

Once the physical assets are built in Drimiopsis, the organization will proceed to assist another resettlement community, and then another.

Currently some of the children are using discarded plastic garbage bags as housing to assist with sleeping at night. Being in a semi-arid – semi desert environment, the temperature variations are extreme, daily.

This is a case of starting with zero and working through all that is required. The immediate requirements are those for 300 children, ranging from babies to eighteen years of age.


